



Break down and recycle leftover cardboard boxes.

- Wrapping paper without foil, cellophane, plastic coating or glitter can be recycled.






- Recycle pizza boxes even with grease stains or cheese.
- Most Valentine's Day cards, without glitter or plastic, and their envelopes can be recycled.
- Roughly half of the average corrugated cardboard box is made up of recycled materials.

- March 18: Global Recycling Day
- On average annually, 92% of all cardboard boxes consumed in the U.S. were recovered for recycling.
- On average, paper and cardboard account for 75% of packaging materials recovered for recycling in the U.S.





Did you know you can compost using cardboard? Wet the cardboard thoroughly and layer with more soil.






Plastic Free July

- Forestry is responsible for the largest supply of municipal drinking water in the country.






- Magazines and newsprint are recyclable. Modern recycling machinery can handle staples, special inks and glossy paper.
- Paper and paper-based packaging are one of the most recycled materials in the U.S.
- Trees in U.S. forests absorb more carbon dioxide than forestry related activities produce.

Paper mills typically reuse water at least 10 times before purifying and returning it to waterways. In 2016, about two-thirds of the energy used by leading mills came from renewable biomass energy. Private forest owners plant about four million trees every day.





 - Don't forget to flatten boxes. Make sure the item is clean and dry. Crumpled paper goes into the recycling bin.

Recycle any stamped paper envelopes from holiday cards. Don't worry about peeling off the stamps either. Flatten boxes for easy storage, and come giftwrapping time you're all ready.
