



Paper Products You Can Recycle



Shipping boxes - don't forget to empty and flatten them first



Mail and envelopes (even with windows), paper greeting cards and coupons



Emptied takeout and frozen food containers, including ice cream cartons



Pizza boxes - even with the grease and stuck on cheese



Glossy magazine and newsprint - no need to remove the staples



Wrapping paper (with no foil, glitter or plastic) and the cardboard tube




White and colored paper



Boxes that pile up - like cereal, candy, cosmetics, shoe and tissue boxes



Beverage cups and drink boxes



Paper bags



Juice and milk cartons (caps can be kept on)



Paper molded egg cartons

Important recycling tips:

- Always check your local guidelines to see what's accepted in your area.** When you wishcycle - put something in the bin hoping it will be recycled - you're actually harming the recycling process.
- Keep paper products dry & clean before placing them in the recycling bin.
- Contact your local hauler or municipality if they don't accept these items to ask them to start.
